
RE encourages our students to reflect spiritually, to think ethically and to be aware of how their religious commitment will help them in everyday life

Component 1 : Foundational Catholic Theology

This component consists of two distinct themes:

- Theme 1 Origins and Meaning
- Theme 2 Good and Evil

Component 2 : Applied Catholic Theology

This component consists of two distinct themes:

- Theme 3 Life and Death
- Theme 4 Sin and Forgiveness

Component 3 : Judaism

This component focuses on the beliefs, teachings and practices of Judaism.



How is the subject assessed?

We use the EDUQAS Specification Route B, which has the following structures:

Paper/Component 2 - 90 minutes (37.5% of the total marks)
